Subj: CHANGE TO THE ORGANIZATION OF THE OFFICE OF THE CHIEF OF NAVAL OPERATIONS MANAGERS' INTERNAL CONTROL PROGRAM

Ref: (a) OPNAV M-5430.48
(b) OPNAVINST 5200.25E

1. Purpose. To realign the reporting relationship and support function for the Managers' Internal Control Program (MICP) under the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations (OPNAV).

2. Background. Director, Navy Staff (DNS) has directed the realignment of the MICP in order to best integrate the program's business practices, correspondence within OPNAV and the echelon 2 commands, and coordination of the Chief of Naval Operations (CNO) Senior Management Council with the CNO's representative to the Secretary of the Navy's (SECNAV) Senior Management Council. CNO's representative to the SECNAV Senior Management Council is currently Deputy Chief of Naval Operations for Integration of Capabilities and Resources (CNO N8).

3. Organizational Changes. Effective immediately, the MICP is realigned under OPNAV per subparagraphs 3a and 3b.

a. Primary responsibility for management, resources, correspondence, and all actions relating to the MICP currently are aligned under DNS (Director of Management Division (DNS-3)). These responsibilities will be realigned to CNO N8.

b. Current mission and functions of the MICP will not be changed by this realignment of the responsibilities within the OPNAV staff. There is no current manning or support to be realigned.

4. Action

a. DNS will:

(1) Update reference (a).

(2) Coordinate with the Office of the Assistant Secretary of the Navy, Financial Management and Comptroller to ensure the new reporting relationship is understood prior to the next quarterly update.

b. CNO N8 will:

(1) Issue a revised OPNAVNOTE 5430 to incorporate MICP mission, functions, and tasks into the CNO N8 mission, functions, and tasks.

(2) Update reference (b).

5. Records Management. Records created as a result of this notice, regardless of media or format, must be managed per SECNAV Manual 5210.1 of January 2012.

6. Cancellation Contingency. This notice will remain in effect for 1 year or until superseded, whichever occurs first. The organization action will remain effective until changed by DNS.
